one of the company is courageous enough to open a fire on the subject of politics or religion, reckless of consequences, and the battle becomes general and ardent. You may introduce any other theme—the whole circle of physical sciences—and, in ninety-nine cases out of a hundred, you will be able to provoke and sustain half an hour's conversation. But advance some theological opinions, or proclaim yourself a friend of Wirt, or Clay, or Jackson, and the voracious blockhead instantly grows intelligent and positive—not a tongue is left—the discomfited of travelers and arguers, and a distant and sustained before the discussion is half consummated, the journey (however protracted) ends, and every man separates from his antagonist inwardly ejaculating, "If I could ride ten miles further with you, I'd fix you!"

How shall we account for all this? Is it because the science of politics or of morals is better understood than any other, or requires less investigation? Exactly the reverse: as this is the answer to my first inquiry.

But of all conveyances, give me a chaise, and a few spirited horses, and I have loved friend at my feet—a bright day, an invigorating air, and a pleasant landscape—and then my cup of enjoyment is full.

In riding from Worcester to Providence, I had a good opportunity to witness the exceeding ferocity and eagerness of the great Worcester Committee, which bore a poor testimony to the value of free labor. Here, every thing intimated independence—happiness—freedom: no driver was seen in the fields with his gang of miserable vassals; the course of slavery had not brightened the ground; the soil was not so fertile, and the soil was not so rich; the hope of reward for his voluntary toil; and many a school-house and village spire demonstrated that the intellects and souls of the inhabitants were placed at a high value. I could not help sighing, in contrasting the miserable condition of the south with the happy state of the north.

In passing through several villages in Rhode-Island, I was surprised to observe the number of factories which towered up on the right hand and the left. Although I have long since withdrawn from the field of politics, I feel a strong interest in the perpetuity of that system which has done so much for the industry of the American people; and consequently, the unexpected sight of these huge establishments, all alive with power, gave me no inconsiderable pleasure—pleasure, however, mingled with pain—for I fear it will be found, in almost every instance, that the most salutary and beneficial effects of the operatives; that the education of the children is neglected; and that unnecessarily severe regulations are made for the government of the factories. I am decidedly in favor of the ten-hours-a-day plan: any extension of labor beyond this period of time, without an adequate remuneration, is, in consequence of physical fraud and wretched economy. Ample repose is needed to restore the wasted energies of the body, and the happiness of the individual. Every thing that tends to the prostration of the value of labor, begets resentment, produces tumult, and is hateful in the sight of God.

This is my first abiding visit to Providence, and I have enjoyed it perfectly. There is not much regularity about the place, but many of the localities are commanding and beautiful. The Arcade is a costly and spacious structure, decidedly superior to that in New-York, or Philadelphia, or Baltimore, (the last mentioned scarcely deserves remembrance) and probably unrivaled in the country. Although, but we must not pass by a passenger car, which should have given last June) upon the new City Hotel, kept by Mr. Wood—a gentleman whose politeness and attention to his visitors add much to the pleasure of their residence, and to whom I have been indebted for a thorough examination of his house. From this site, the cellars, and the intervals between the stories are singularly elegant—there is seemingly not an inch of room wasted or misapplied; it has several large and beautiful rooms for the accommodation of parties or families—a spacious hall capable of holding several hundred people—and numerous well-arranged private apartments. Every thing is new, elegant, and appropriate, without any betrayal of meanness or prodigality. The supply of the table are abundant and various, served up in a superior style. Altogether, it is decidedly the best hotel I have found in any of the cities; and I commend it in an especial manner to the patronage of travelers.

As I came through this City in June, I made a short visit to the venerable Moses Brown, (the patriarch of Friends, who is now in his ninety-first year). I have just returned from a second visit, highly gratified to find that his health continues generally in the most excellent state. He is certainly an extraordinary man, and sustains the high weight of almost a century in an extraordinary manner. His interest in all the great philanthropic movements of the age rather increases than suffers diminution—especially in the abolition cause. From the commencement of the Colonization Society down to the recent visit of our Joshua N. Duffin, ("one Arnold Duffin, a latter!") he has been frequently annoyed by its agents, who have artfully sought to obtain his approbation of this unholy combination—but in vain. He has met them all promptly, and exposed the folly and wickedness of the project. He is certainly, indeed, done, he feel on this subject, that he assured me, on my first visit, that old as he was, he was at times almost tempted to take up his pen, (and he writes vigorously even now) and oppose the Society! He expressed his surprise and regret that "The Friend," a paper published in New-York, had published an article in its columns favorable to the scheme. This truly benevolent and good man has done much to promote the temporal and eternal welfare of the colored population of Providence, and will cherish his kindness in their memories

long after his departure to a better world. He feels much interested in the New-England Anti-Slavery Society, and manifested considerable pleasure in being made acquainted with its steady growth. I left him, this morning, conversing in a spirited strain in his carriage with an aged resident six months older than himself, and who is yet active and strong: they had never met before. Each had a store of ancient reminiscences to unfold—extending back 60, 70, and 80 years, or more—and it was curious to see how easily they removed their minds to any former scene, and revealed the hidden things of oblivion. "May Heaven long preserve the life of this venerable man!"

During my visit at his dwelling, an individual from New-York was introduced, named — (a relative of the patriarch, and a member of the Society of Friends, whose department was somewhat poetic and — acquired, no doubt, in the school-room, as I was a teacher. The subjects of slavery and colonization being introduced, he instantly avowed himself hostile to immediate abolition, and (of course) friendly to the Colonization Society. He then began to expatiate on the merits of his cause, in unsuited terms to domestic — one Garrison, or Garrison, or some such name—a madman, a fanatic, and a radical, who was calling for the immediate liberation of all the slaves in this country," &c. &c. This personal assault was exceedingly disagreeable to the company, and I could not refrain from laughter. Assuming as such glibly as possible, I asked him whether he knew Mr. Garrison personally? He replied, no. Are you familiar with his sentiments? I again inquired.
