



Challenge: Funding for social housing reduced by 88% after the 2007-2008 economic bust

POLITICAL



Influenced policy that supports reform of social housing funding, and sets high targets for new social housing

SOCIAL



Social housing lending by the Housing Finance Agency increased from €7.6 to €261.2 million

Social housing funding more sustainable and less vulnerable to economic crashes
