How to contribute to Ruby on Rails

Did you find a bug?

- Do not open up a GitHub issue if the bug is a security vulnerability in Rails, and instead to refer to our policy.
- Ensure the bug was not already reported by searching on GitHub under Issues.
- If you're unable to find an open issue addressing the problem, open a new one. Be sure to include a title a
 clear description, as much relevant information as possible, and a code sample or an executable test ca
 demonstrating the expected behavior that is not occurring.
- If possible, use the relevant bug report templates to create the issue. Simply copy the content of the app template into a .rb file, make the necessary changes to demonstrate the issue, and paste the content int issue description:
